

Kvibergs HK stands for JOY - COMMUNITY - ENGAGEMENT



Welcome to Kvibergs HK!

The club was founded in 2014 to encourage more young people to play handball in the north-eastern parts of Gothenburg. Today, the club has more than 20 teams participating in league play and approximately 400 members.

We mainly play at Kvibergs Park Ice and Sports Hall, but also at other sports halls in our local area. Our location in Kviberg gives us the opportunity to bring people together from different neighbourhoods in eastern Gothenburg and thereby contribute to greater integration in our community.

Kvibergs HK is a non-profit association that relies on all parents contributing to a well-functioning club where children can thrive and develop in a safe environment.

As a child/player in Kvibergs HK, you are expected to:

- Be a good friend to everyone on the team and a good role model for younger players.
- Have a positive attitude and always show respect for players, coaches, parents and the club.
- Arrive on time for training sessions and matches and be properly prepared (food, rest and the correct equipment).
- Not complain about referees, teammates or opponents.
- Show good sportsmanship, regardless of the result or how the opposing team plays (#Schysstmatch, #Fairplay).

As the parent or guardian of a player in Kvibergs HK, you are expected to:

- Have a positive attitude and always show respect for players, coaches, referees, parents and the club.
- Respond to training session invitations in Laget.se, make sure that your child arrives on time for training sessions and matches, and ensure that they are properly prepared with regard to food, rest and the correct equipment.
- Pay the membership, player licence and training fees on time. Payment of all fees is required in order to participate in training sessions and matches.
- Attend parent meetings.
- Show good sportsmanship, regardless of the result or how the opposing team plays (#Schysstmatch, #Fairplay).
- Inform the coaches if your child has any allergies or any other important information they need to know about your child.
- Take responsibility for borrowed equipment, such as a match jersey. You will be liable for the replacement cost if the match jersey cannot be returned in sound condition.

In addition to the above, parents are required to volunteer in various roles within the team and the club. This creates a social community, helps provide our children a safe and rewarding leisure activity, and enables parents to take an active part in their own child's activities.

Even if you are unable to take on a specific role, you are still expected to contribute with your time and commitment, for example in connection with home events and fundraising activities such as sales.

Membership, player licence and training fees

The invoice for the 2026/2027 season will be sent out in September. New for this year, the Swedish Handball Federation has decided that the player licence fee will be paid individually rather than per team. The invoice will therefore cover three items: the membership fee, player licence and training fee.

Fritidskortet (Leisure Activity Card)

Fritidskortet is a financial support scheme that can be used to pay for leisure activities for children and young people aged 6 to 16. Each child receives SEK 550, which can be used to pay for organised activities in sports, outdoor recreation, culture and other association-based activities. Children living in households that received housing allowance during the previous year may receive SEK 2,500 per year.

Kvibergs HK is included in the Fritidskortet register and can therefore be selected as an association when using Fritidskortet. For more information, visit: www.fritidskortet.se

Match and training clothing

Our new supplier of club clothing is Klubbhuset, and the new brand is Hummel. The online shop will be available shortly and will offer a competitively priced starter package including shorts, a T-shirt and a tracksuit. The club will phase in Hummel over a three-year period, so adidas kits may continue to be used during this time.

The club provides match jerseys on loan, while players must provide their own match shorts. Match shorts must be black. For training, suitable shoes are required, while players may choose their own training clothes.

Fundraising/sales activities

The teams carry out sales activities each year to finance tournaments and other enjoyable team activities. The club has only one mandatory sales activity: a set of Bingolotto tickets/calendars in connection with Christmas. This sale has set minimum number of tickets to sell. If you are unable to participate in this sales activity, you may opt out by paying a fee (SEK 500 for the 2026/2027 season). All parents are encouraged to help with other fundraising activities to the best of their ability.
