Matches

Equipment

- For matches, players may borrow a **shirt, shorts and goalkeeper gloves**
 - All other equipment (**socks, shin pads, boots, water bottle, etc.**) must be provided by each player
 - Club clothing is ordered through **Unisport**
 - We do not play wearing caps. Goalkeepers may, however, wear a cap for protection from the sun
 - No necklaces, earrings or watches during training or matches (**not permitted under Swedish FA rules**)
